COVID Vaccine and Kids:

Governor DeWine announced COVID-19 Pfizer vaccinations are available to Ohio's youth age 12 years and older, following members of the CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommending the use of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine for this age group.

Additionally, the Vax-A-Million provided Ohioans 17 and under who were eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccination to be entered into a drawing for a full, four-year scholarship to any of Ohio's state colleges and universities, including full tuition, room and board, and books. A total of five weekly drawings for a full, four-year scholarship took place. The winners were announced on the Ohio website located at <https://ohiovoxamillion.com/>
