ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR

Mr. Bichara said the city recently received a check from Cuyahoga County in the amount of \$150,000, which was a reimbursement for the Glenridge resurfacing that recently took place. He said just in time to close out one grant, is the beginning of next year's grant season. Mr. Bichara said he previously forwarded to council, a notice that we will be holding our public meeting about both the Municipal Grant Program and also the Supplemental Grant Program on Wednesday, October 26th at 6:30 p.m. here in council chambers. He said he always appreciates everyone's support.

Mr. Ali thanked Mr. Bichara for helping us get the application applied for the Bark Park grant. He said they are trying to get a grant to put up a pavilion, and Mr. Bichara has been very helpful.

SERVICE DIRECTOR

Mr. Herron said leaf collection will start on Monday, October 17th. He said an informational code red message will be sent out very shortly.

EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT

Mr. Downey said we had a wonderful weekend last week, with the ribbon cutting for the new police station. He said in a couple of weeks, we will begin to open the building up and move in.

Mayor Castelli said he believes it is already on the council site. He said we do tend to get a lot of calls, and said he knew that the council office and Judi in his office, walk people through where they vote. Mayor Castelli said either way, they will make sure there is a link, but said residents can also call.
