Seconded by Mr. Meany. ACCEPT INSURANCE 57 Mr. Bortolotto said this was discussed at the finance committee meeting. He said PROPOSAL: this is the life insurance policy that is available to our city. Mr. Bortolotto NATIONAL INSURANCE confirmed that there weren't any changes. **SERVICES** 60 Mr. Stewart said this is a flat renewal for two years, and the premium has been the 61 same since 2018.

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Mr. Bortolotto introduced RESOLUTION NO. 2022-90, A Resolution authorizing the mayor and finance director to enter into contracts for employee health coverage with Medical Mutual of Ohio for a period of one year and MOVED TO ADOPT. Seconded by Mr. Sage.

RES. 2022-90 ADOPTED CONTRACT: MEDICAL MUTUAL

- 5 Mr. Bortolotto said this was discussed at the finance committee meeting, and the 6 increase is very small. He said from what he has heard, this year there are many large increases. 8
- Mr. Stewart said the overall increase is about five percent, the admin fees were about two and a half percent. 10
- Mr. Bortolotto said he has heard from other cities increases varying from 12% to 11 12
- 13 Mr. Ali asked if this was due to better health.
- 14 Mr. Stewart said that could be some of it. He said they have implemented some 15 changes in the last go around to implement a preferred tier at Southwest General, 16 and that has been a very good thing for our plan. 17
- Mr. Ali asked if there would be any advantage to renew the contract for longer 18 19 than one year.
- 20 Mr. Stewart said generally they won't offer us one. He said we are self-insured, 21 so the cost is really the cost of the claims for us.

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Mr. Bortolotto introduced ORDINANCE NO. 2022-91, An Ordinance declaring the improvement to certain parcels of real property within the city to be a public purpose and exempt from taxation pursuant to ORC 5709.40(B); providing for the collection and deposit of service payments and specifying the purposes for which those service payments may be expended; specifying the public infrastructure improvements directly benefiting the parcels; and authorizing school compensation payments (Southland Redevelopment) and MOVED TO ADOPT. Seconded by Mr. Ference.

ORD. 2022-91 ADOPTED TIF PAYMENTS: SOUTHLAND REDEVELOPMENT

34 Mr. Bortolotto said this is the property at the corner of Pearl and W. 130th.

35 Mr. Stewart said the TIF payments would be used for Southland Redevelopment, 36 as we continue to work toward the redevelopment of the Southland area and 37 public infrastructure improvements associated with this project. He said the city 38 is estimated to receive approximately \$40,000 annually from the TIF, and the 39 Berea City School District will receive an additional \$70,000 per year from the 40 41 TIF.

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Mayor Castelli introduced ORDINANCE NO. 2022-92, An Ordinance to make supplemental appropriations for current expenditures and expenses for the City of Middleburg Heights for the calendar year 2022 and moved to adopt. On behalf of the mayor, Mr. Bortolotto MOVED TO ADOPT. Seconded by Mr. Ference.

ORD. 2022-92 ADOPTED SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS

Mayor Castelli said they were able to find a replacement vehicle this year that is a better price, so it made sense to purchase this year versus waiting till next year paying a potentially higher price.

Mr. Herron said this vehicle was found in Columbus. He said the local dealerships around here were approximately \$6,000 more than the pickup truck found in Columbus. Mr. Herron said this truck was \$49,000, and 2023 the state bid was going to be going up to \$57,000.

Mayor Castelli said the \$67,000 is the total bid, with everything that is added to 12 13 the pick-up truck. He said per Mr. Stewart's recommendation, they thought it made sense to save money and purchase the truck this year. 15

Mr. Sage confirmed that this truck was not appropriated for in 2022.

Mayor Castelli said that is correct.

17 Mr. Stewart said currently this truck was listed for 2023, which will be removed. 18
