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Mayor Castelli introduced ORDINANCE NO. 2022-93, An Ordinance to make supplemental appropriations for current expenditures and expenses for the City of Middleburg Heights for the calendar year 2022 and moved to adopt. On behalf of the mayor, Mr. Bortolotto MOVED TO ADOPT. Seconded by Mr. Ference.

ORD. 2022-93 ADOPTED SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS

Mayor Castelli said at the end of the year, we typically do a clean-up supplemental appropriation ordinance. He said this ordinance has been discussed at the finance committee and turned it over to Finance Director Stewart to add his comments.

Mr. Stewart said as the mayor stated, this supplemental is done every year. He said they talked about the overtime issues we are experiencing in the service department, police department and fire department at the budget hearings. Mr. Stewart said we are \$350,000-\$400,000 under our wage appropriation for the year. He said we do have to advance money as we wait for reimbursement from the sewer district, from the purchase of a vacuum truck earlier this year. Mr. Stewart said in section three, there are two departments within the recreation center, as they talked about last Monday that stems from 20 years ago. He said some money had to be moved between those two departments, but will no longer have to do that moving forward. Mr. Stewart said there is a longer list of items on the back of the legislation, and said in the state of Ohio, we are required to have a balanced budget in each fund. He said the appropriation of a fund cannot exceed the estimated resources of that fund. Mr. Stewart said as revenue estimates come in under expectations, we need to reduce those revenue estimates, and at times we need to reduce those appropriations so we do not cause that budgetary violation of the appropriations exceeding the resources. He said if revenues come in higher than expected, then an additional appropriation is done to facilitate payments.

Mr. Bortolotto commended Mr. Stewart and his team for the great job they do on the budget and for all of their efforts.

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Mayor Castelli introduced ORDINANCE NO. 2022-94, An Ordinance to make appropriations for current expenditures and expenses for the City of Middleburg Heights for the calendar year 2023 and declaring an emergency and moved to adopt. On behalf of the mayor, Mr. Bortolotto MOVED TO ADOPT. Seconded by Mr. McGregor.

60 Mayor Castelli said this is the budget for 2023. He said this was reviewed at the budget meeting, and ultimately this is the final that came out of that meeting.

Mayor Castelli said he was going to discuss the next several ordinances, as all of these contracts that are coming forward from our unions are very similar, at least in the main points. He said he was going to hit the highlights that are consistent throughout all of these contracts, which will also be applied to our non-union employees. He said these are three year contracts. Mayor Castelli said the contracts for wages will be three percent, three percent, and three percent. He said an additional holiday is being added, as well as two personal days.

Mr. Ali asked how the FOP was working out.

Mayor Castelli said he thinks that would be a question for that particular union. He said as far as the negotiations went, all of our unions, the representation and the members that are on the boards were extremely professional. Mayor Castelli said they appreciate what city council does, as well as, what the city is doing and the administration and the success of the community. He said certainly we don't always agree on everything, but ultimately we come to an agreement that is good both for the community, as well as, our employees.

He said his reasoning was that his wife as very bad dementia, and they call 9-1-1 and the fire department came out and he felt that fire department saved his wife's life. Mr. Grech said he called the mayor and asked how to do this, and could it be legally done. He said the mayor said yes we can. Mr. Grech called the resident back to tell him we were all set, that the city could accept the donation. He said the resident said he wasn't giving the city a check for \$25,000 he wanted to give the city a check for \$50,000. He said on behalf of the ward four resident, he gave the check to the mayor for \$50,000. Mr. Grech said this individual came to the plate once before when the city had the major blackout, and he donated \$15,000 to the city for blankets, cots, generators, etc. for the community center when there wasn't any electricity. He said he has been friends with this man for 45 years, and he is honored to have him as his
