Mr. Grech made a motion to grant preliminary approval to Ruggiero Construction
for the Benedict Drive and Interstate 71 new subdivision as approved by the
Planning Commission on February 22, 2023. Seconded by Mr. Meany.

Mr. Grech said this project includes 16 homes. He said a variance was needed for three of the homes because of the angle of the wall on I-71, moving three of the houses up five feet to give the homeowner a little more backyard.

Mayor Castelli introduced ORDINANCE NO. 2023-20, An Ordinance authorizing the mayor to enter into an agreement with the Board of Park Commissioners of the Cleveland Metropolitan Park District for the transfer by deed of gift a vacant lot at 18880 East Bagley adjacent to the Big Creek Reservation of the Cleveland Metroparks and moved to adopt. On behalf of the mayor, Mr. Bortolotto MOVED TO ADOPT. Seconded by Mr. McGregor.

Mayor Castelli said this is a two acre parcel off of Bagley Road, next to where the current Vitalia project is proposed, which is a separate parcel. He said as we look at our trails and trees initiative, that has been supported by city council, this is another opportunity to preserve greenspace in the community. Mayor Castelli said they would like to ultimately transfer this property to the Metroparks. He said this property will connect into the Lake to Lake Trail. Mayor Castelli said this property will also provide an opportunity over the next several years, to put a trail head in off of Bagley Road, which will ultimately create these additional arteries that lead into our Metroparks areas including the Lake to Lake Trail. He said our Law Director, Santo Incorvaia, worked on this with the Metroparks.

Mr. Incorvaia said the only thing he would also like council to know is that there is a commitment from the Metroparks to put a trail in within five years.

Mr. Bortolotto assumed that they own the property to the east of this.

Mr. Incorvaia said yes, it is adjacent to Big Creek Reservation.

Mr. Bortolotto asked if they reached out to the city, or if the city reached out to them.

Mayor Castelli said we reached out to them. He said they have had conversations with the Metroparks about a variety of areas throughout the city. Mayor Castelli said if you look at a lot of our trails, they tend to be very linear throughout the community. Mayor Castelli said the Metroparks has an interest, as well as we do as a community, to create these other arteries to allow for additional connections into our larger park areas.

Mr. Sage confirmed that this trail head would connect from off of Bagley Road back to the Lake to Lake Trail.

Mayor Castelli said yes, this will create a more visible trail head for that side of the Lake to Lake Trail.

Mr. Sage said Vitalia would be right next to this.
