AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Ms. Sally Schuler, 18869 Mallard Cove, said she has concerns regarding Breezeline. She said she called Mr. Meany and shared her story with him and he suggested coming to the meeting to keep council in the loop. She said after her conversation with Breezeline today she called the Ohio Attorney General. Ms. Schuler said in May 2022, her Breezeline bill was \$149 and only has basic cable.

She said she called Breezeline in June when they bought out WOW and her bill had increased to approximately \$169. Ms. Schuler said the representative explained the costs with purchasing a new company and assured her that she was receiving a promotion that will last for 24 months. She said today she received an email and her bill is up to approximately \$192. Ms. Schuler said not even a year ago, she was assured that she was receiving a promotion that would keep her at \$169.44 for 24 months. She said after many phone calls she still can't remedy the program and asked if the city could help her in this matter. She said this is fraud because they won't honor her promotional contract.

Mr. Grech said she is not alone with this, adding that this happened to him as well. He said these companies don't care, and that he also called the Attorney General as well, but didn't get anywhere.

Mr. Ali asked if Ms. Schuler contacted the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio.

Mr. Ali suggested contacting them too. He said that is the muscle for all of the utility companies.

Mr. Herron said the Public Utilities Commission, which is regulated by the Ohio
Department of Commerce. He said if you go to their website, they have a video
section and you can actually send emails. Mr. Herron said they work with them a
lot. He said Ohio took away cable franchises from the local communities
approximately 15 years ago, and are now regulated by the state. Mr. Herron said
they are very good to work with and are very responsive.

Ms. Schuler asked if a community has the power to not let a vendor provide services in their community.

Mr. Incorvais said as a followoup to what Mr. Harron montioned about the

Mr. Incorvaia said as a follow-up to what Mr. Herron mentioned about the Department of Commerce, when cable companies began, they were franchises, and each community could grant a franchise or more than one franchise. He said communities would get a small percent (one or two percent). Mr. Incorvaia reiterated as Mr. Herron said, the state legislature decided that would take away the power of franchise from local communities and they were going to be the sole entity that would oversee cable franchise. He said unfortunately, we don't have the right to take away a cable companies right to operate in Middleburg Heights. Mr. Incorvaia said when we had a franchise law, we had the ability to control rate hikes and review rate hikes but not anymore.

Mayor Castelli thanked Ms. Schuler for coming forward. He said they are all very familiar with these concerns. Mayor Castelli said he will work with Mr. Meany, and also reach out to our state representative.

Mr. Ali said ABC Rental is a big company and always does a very good job. He inquired as if there is any other company that other cities around here use besides ABC Rental.

Mr. Bichara said our main tent is 40' x 100' and not many companies carry that size tent. He said ABC Rental has been very good with their prices and they are local right here in Parma Heights. Mr. Bichara said otherwise we would have to get our main tent from them, and then have to go elsewhere for the other items.

Mr. Downey said last week Mr. McGregor requested to look into the materials that we have available about NOPEC. Mr. Ali appreciated all of the information and effort from both Mr. McGregor and Mr. Downey. He said nobody understands this, he said it is so confusing. Mr. Ali asked if there was any way that we can come up with a simple here is what is being charged, and put that together so residents could make an educated decision. He said he very simply wants to know what is the best route to go. Mr. Ali asked if that was possible.

Mr. McGregor said the reason he brought this to Mr. Downey's attention is because several residents had concerns and asked him about the rate increases that were coming up. He said there Mr. Downey informed him that there is going to be something on our website for the residents. Mr. McGregor said he spoke with Mr. Meany and possibly in May, we could have NOPEC come into the Streets and Utilities Committee meeting. He said in April, the Board of Health is coming in.
