Mr. Herron said the rest of the project SECTION TO BAGLEY remains the same, we are just adding the Bagley Road/Big Creek Parkway 29 ROAD TRAFFIC intersection to the project. SIGNAL REPLACE-Mr. Bortolotto asked if it was known as to when that would be done. 31 MENT PROJECT Mr. Herron said he didn't know, they will have to bid the project. He said depending on supply chain issues, if we were really fortunate it could be this fall, but he anticipated it would be started early next year. Mr. Ali said he could not believe how many poles didn't make it. 36 Mr. Herron said they were steel poles. He said the new poles will be galvanized 37 and won't rust. Mr. Herron said if you look at the poles that were closer to the 38 roads that got salt on them, those were the ones that we had the issues with. Mr. Ali said if you go back to the records, that was discussed when those poles 40 41 were purchased. He said supposedly the manufacturer said because of the coating, 42 that wouldn't happen. 43 Mr. Herron said it was nearly 30 years ago. 44 Mr. McGregor asked when the original poles were purchased. 45 Mr. Herron said the original poles were purchased around 1995 or 1996. Seconded by Mr. Meany. 3 Mr. Bortolotto said this legislation has to do with some additions to the police lieutenants contract. He asked Mr. Stewart to explain. Mr. Stewart said back in late March, we approved the collective bargaining agreement for the police lieutenants. He said upon final review, there were three 8 provisions that were included within the patrolmen and sergeants contracts that were excluded/omitted from the lieutenants contract. 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Mr. McGregor asked Mr. Incorvaia if he could provide him with legislation about the ORC and jake brakes. He said he has several residents concerned about this.

Mr. McGregor said they thought there was signage on the 71 exit coming down onto Bagley that said you weren't allowed to use them, and now the signage is gone. He said the trucks have been using jake brakes again. Mr. McGregor said he reached out to the chief who said he would get back to him, but he hasn't heard anything. He asked Mr. Incorvaia if he could help him and follow up on this.

Mr. Herron said he thought the chief had sent an email. He said that sign was a state sign, and they said they would not put a jake brake sign back up on the entrance ramp. Mr. Herron said any of the entrance ramps, or the surrounding property is all owned by the state and they control the signage.

Mr. McGregor said he would go back and search that again.

Mr. Ali asked Mr. Herron, if we cannot use "jake brake" specifically, he said he sees no engine braking signs all over the place. He asked if we could do that instead to help the residents out.

Mr. Herron said there was a response from ODOT. He said he will make sure he gets that email and forward it on to you. Mr. Herron said they didn't seem to engaged to put signs up. He said they gave a nice answer, but didn't seem like they were going to install signs like that. Mr. Herron said he would find that email from the chief and forward it to the clerk of council.

FINANCE DIRECTOR

RECREATION DIRECTOR

Mr. Elliott referred to the partnership between the Berea City School and the City of Middleburg Heights to make improvements to the tennis courts at the middle school. He said that wasn't done in the fall, they were waiting for nicer weather. Mr. Elliott said in the last couple weeks that was completed and is drying. He said the courts should be completed tomorrow. Mr. Elliott said besides being striped for tennis, two of the courts will be striped for pickle ball. He said they are working on a schedule as to how that will work this summer. Mr. Elliott said they will have more information on that at a later time. He said the outdoor pool will open this Saturday, May 27th. Mr. Elliott said they will be closed on Monday for Memorial Day. He said the scoreboards on all three fields were installed in the last week, as was the new swing set. Mr. Elliott said the swings will be put on this week by Friday. He thanked Mr. Herron and the service department for their assistance for both of those projects.

Mr. Ali asked Mr. Elliott when the tennis court and pickle ball courts will be completed.

Mr. Elliott said it is completed, it is just drying. He said they crack sealed/filled it as well as the striping. Mr. Elliott said he received an email from the athletic director stating that they needed to get to mid-week, May 24th to finish drying. He said as of Thursday, May 25th you should be able to get back on the courts. Mr. Elliott said during the school year, the way that agreement worked, was that the schools had priority. He said as we enter into summer, the schedule will be dictated by us.

Mr. McGregor said Mr. Elliott said something to the affect that the nets might be locked to the fencing.

Mr. Elliott said they are still working that out. He said one thing he talked to the schools about, was when the work was being done the gate was locked. Mr. Elliott said they may try that and just lock the gate. He hoped that would secure them, and would be the most convenient.

Mr. McGregor asked if it was possible to put signage by the entrance gate that if the gate is locked to call the rec, especially this summer.

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Mr. Elliott said there will be signage with the general rules, hours, phone numbers, etc. 1 2 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR 4 No report. 5 Mr. McGregor asked if the gas station on the corner was closed now. Mr. Bichara said yes, that is closed and the city is reviewing plans for redevelopment of that site, along with the neighboring site. He said demolition should begin in early June. Mr. Bichara said that will be another key 9 development, that he thinks everyone will be very pleased with. 10 11 12 SERVICE DIRECTOR Mr. Herron said there will be a Memorial Day ceremony over at memorial hall at the police station on Monday at 10:30 a.m. He thanked the service crew for getting all the flowers and plants done. 16 Mr. Grech asked Mr. Herron if all the construction in ward 4 was AT&T. He said 17 there are tubes, conduit and wires sticking all over the ground, as well as 18 equipment on the tree lawns. 19 20 Mr. Herron said yes, it will probably be about two more months. He said they are 21 installing high speed fiber optic. 22 Discussion continued. 23 Mr. Grech referred to James between Trenton Trail and Indian Creek Drive that was black topped, and asked if that would be finished with concrete.
