Mayor Castelli introduced ORDINANCE NO. 2023-51, An Ordinance authorizing the mayor and finance director to enter into a purchase agreement for the purchase of certain real estate in the City of Middleburg Heights to be used for public purpose and moved to adopt. On behalf of the mayor, Mr. Bortolotto

Mayor Castelli said these two pieces of legislation are important and a major move towards realizing our master plan and strategic vision for the Southland redevelopment. He said these two ordinances will give the City of Middleburg Heights the control over approximately 19 acres in the Southland district, which is the largest area of land in Southland. Mayor Castelli said they believe strongly that this is vital to achieve our strategic vision. He said the amount for this piece of legislation, which is the 3.86-acre parcel is \$400,000 for the purchase and additional is being appropriated for incidentals as they come up.

Mr. Ali said he thinks this was the only way to escalate this so we would be able to see our vision on that property.

Mayor Castelli introduced ORDINANCE NO. 2023-52, An Ordinance authorizing the mayor and finance director to enter into a purchase agreement for the purchase of certain real estate in the City of Middleburg Heights as part of the Middleburg Heights Community Master Plan and Revitalization of Southland Shopping Center and moved to adopt. On behalf of the mayor, Mr. Bortolotto MOVED TO ADOPT. Seconded by Mr. Sage.

ORD. 2023-52 ADOPTED PURCHASE AGREEMENT -6950 W. 130TH STREET (372-31-006)

Mayor Castelli said the number to be placed on this legislation is \$2.1 million. He said this gives our community control of over 19 acres in our largest commercial district. Mayor Castelli said ultimately this will lead to the realization of our master plan that residents, city council and stakeholders have worked on for years. He said he appreciates city council's support and their vision in moving this forward.

Mr. Ference said as Mr. Ali said, he feels this is a historic opportunity for our city to move forward with the redevelopment of the Southland district. He commended the mayor and his team for putting this together.

Mr. Bortolotto commended the mayor, economic development director and service director. He said if anyone wants to see how this is going to end up, take a good look at the aging, old shopping strip that was on Pearl Road that has turned into a brand new, dynamic commercial area.

Mr. Ali said he agrees with purchasing both of these. He said you need that package deal so the entire plan can be put together.
