AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Mr. Ronald Makovich, 16585 Glenridge Ave, said he has been a resident in the community for 49 years, a registered architect in the state of Ohio and founding partner of Makovich and Pusti Architects. He gave a brief background regarding his past city involvement which goes back to the 1970's. Mr. Makovich came forward tonight to make everyone aware of property maintenance issues in our city. Mr. Makovich said there are commercial things that he has observed, and his personal concern has been the residential housing stock in our community. He said he lives across the street from a residence that has been rented for 25 years, specifically outlining many property maintenance issues. Mr. Makovich said the property he is referring to is located at 16590 Glenridge Avenue. He said everyone here has seen properties in distress in this city. Mr. Makovich said for the record, he would like to exhibit images of the items that he just spoke of from the above referenced property. He said these images have been witnessed and verified by Councilman McGregor. Mr. Makovich asked for Mr. McGregor and the mayor to tour this property regarding. He asked what the fines were for noncompliance and when those fines go into place. He said the housing inspector and building department have observed these issues for years. Mr. Makovich said the general consensus of the neighbors is that they don't have the time and don't want to get involved. He gave examples of other situations where citations and fines would be issued and would need to be addressed. Mr. Makovich said these

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is taking the time to raise questions and to look for answers. 3 Mayor Castelli said we are all on the same page, and want our housing stock to continue to improve. He said he was at this residence, and did follow-up with the 6 building department. Mayor Castelli said there is a meeting tomorrow identifying all of the issues with the owner. He said if the violations are not done, then the 8 next step in the process is that they would need to go to court and could be fined. 10

violations go on and on without consequences. He said as a concerned citizen, he

Mayor Castelli said we are in the process of hiring a new building inspector, and will be looking at other structural things. He said he feels very strongly that it is important for our housing stock to continue to stay strong. Mayor Castelli said he appreciates council's support, and over the last several years we have had multiple nuisance abatements, demolished buildings and have seen new homes built in their place. He said we want to make sure these issues are addressed with a sense of urgency. Mayor Castelli said he followed up with Mr. McGregor and with Mr. Herwerden, and was told that they have been in communication with Mr.

> Ms. Martha Ratkowski. 6719 Stroud Road, asked if tiny houses are allowed in Middleburg Heights.

Mayor Castelli said there is a requirement of a certain square footage.

Ms. Ratkowski said she feels tiny houses, or in-law suites should be allowed to be built onto existing residences, adding that many people in Middleburg Heights have large plots of land. She said the housing market is unaffordable for many people, seniors would benefit by being able to be close to their children if they couldn't afford health care facilities, and the family unit also benefits children as well, with built-in babysitters. Ms. Ratkowski said there is an increase in the percentage of autistic children, and over 185,000 cases of adults in Ohio between the ages of 18-84 that may be able to live on their own, but are in need of supervision.

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Mr. Robert White, 13540 Indian Creek Drive, asked if the property that was purchased by the city at Southland was the Sears property.

Mayor Castelli said yes, we are currently looking at purchasing the Sears property.

Mayor Castelli said the planning commission and city council have done a great job going through every detail associated with the new zoning code. He again reiterated that he appreciated city council's efforts, as well as all of the administration members that were involved and the planning commission too.

Mr. Ference also thanked the planning commission for their diligence in this project, and looking this legislation over carefully while considering everything that goes into it.

Mayor Castelli said this supplemental is for Sheldon Road. He said we are going to be doing a partnership with Brook Park to replace an outdated and problematic waterline. Mayor Castelli said this waterline impacts many residents on the Middleburg Heights side as well as Brook Park. He said there is a project for resurfacing for Sheldon Road, and in communicating with Brook Park it makes sense to take care of the problematic waterline. Mayor Castelli said the \$450,000 is part of our share, and this money will come out of our city water fund that we collect.

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Mr. Stewart said the initial expenditure will come from the streets infrastructure fund and we will be reimbursed by the water fund.

He said a lot of infrastructure improvements are being done to our main corridors. Mayor Castelli said those were the last main arteries that needed to be done in the community. He said as council knows, there are certainly a lot more streets that we will have to do, but our main arteries will be completed soon.
