Mayor Castelli added that we have also been awarded a grant for \$1.25 million 4 dollars through the federal government that is currently still in the spending bill, which was sent to the senate. He said we hope that eventually there will be 7 approval from the senate, and then we will also be able to hopefully get that 8 money to put toward the Indian Creek Relief Sewer. Mayor Castelli said it looks like we may fully be able to fund this through a grant and zero percent interest 10 loans.
