#### **AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION**

Mr. Robert White, Indian Creek Drive, asked for the status of the Middleburg Heights sewer project.

Mayor Castelli said as you know, we are waiting on a final grant that was coming out of the federal government part of their spending bill. He said we have been approved for that, but are waiting on some of the details. Mayor Castelli said there was an engineering meeting this week, and spoke to Mr. Herron regarding reaching out to Congressman Max Miller's office to get a status update.

Mr. Herron said he contacted Congressman Miller's staff, and should hear back soon. He said we are trying to figure out who the contact is for the U.S. EPA, because that is the agency that will administer the grant. Mr. Herron said the bid documents are together and ready to go, but additional items are required for federal grants. He said they don't anticipate that there will be anything that will be a major consequence, but it will take our engineers time to get it together. Mr. Herron said our goal is to have the project bid next year, and to get started. He said once everything is lined up, we will bid the project. He said this is a large project, and anticipate that it will be a two year project.

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Mr. Stewart said this is a continuation of the current plan that we put into place that was discussed last Monday, and appreciates council's support.

Mayor Castelli said the city desires to retain the services of a competent and qualified contractor to provide certain products/services to the City. He said South Short is competent and qualified to furnish products and/or services to the City and has provided a responsive and responsible proposal and desires to provide City Campus Fiber Connections. Mayor Castelli said we have been talking about getting all of the buildings connected, so this will ultimately do that. He said Mr. Stewart is working with Nick Artman on this project and asked if he would like to add some more details.

Mr. Stewart said as we prepare for demolition of the former police station, all of the current phone and data lines terminate into that facility. He said we have begun to move them out of that facility into the new police station. Mr. Stewart said this is to connect all of the building with underground fiber, and will also allow us to discontinue leasing the fiber connections with Breezeline. He said this will save the city approximately \$10,000 a year by doing this as well.

Mayor Castelli said we will ultimately be able to connect some additional things throughout the park as well too.

Mr. Ali asked if the cable was going to run from the old police station to the new station.

Mr. Stewart said the current police station has a new connection that is connected to city hall. He said the new connections will pick up from the police station, go around the park and pick the buildings all the way up to the community center. Mr. Stewart said they will abandon the connections that are currently in the old police station.

Mr. Sage said he was going to abstain for a possible business conflict.

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#### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR**

Mr. Bichara wished Mr. Downey well in his retirement. He said when he was with the City of South Euclid, Mr. Downey was Mr. Cleveland Heights. Mr. Bichara said as fate would have it, he got to work with him again too. He again wished him well.

#### SERVICE DIRECTOR

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Mr. Herron congratulated council, and said our friend and colleague, John Grech, will surely be missed. He said when he worked for the Cuyahoga County Department of Development, he met Bob Downey when he worked for Cleveland Heights. Mr. Herron wished Mr. Downey the best.

Mr. Sage said he spoke to a resident today, who was at our meeting a couple weeks ago regarding the light sequencing on Fry, Middlebrook and Craigmere. He said the resident advised that nothing is any better, and asked if that has been looked at as of yet.

Mr. Herron said they talked to our traffic consultant, and said the danger when you start putting flashing yellow lights, is that people don't stop at lights, which can lead to accidents. He said the lights are only triggered when cars pull up to that light. Mr. Herron said if no one pulls up to that light it isn't going to trigger. He said it doesn't trigger automatically, it triggers in five seconds or so. Mr. Herron said he feels it is a safety issue, and does not recommend altering those lights. He said he knows it is a minor inconvenience, but said public safety would outweigh auto accidents.

Mayor Castelli said he knew that Mr. Herron had the consultants review and discuss this. He asked if the consultants could put their thoughts in a memo to see if there is any other alternative. Mayor Castelli thought that would be helpful, and then Mr. Sage could provide that information to the resident.

Mr. Herron said they also mentioned if people don't have an expectation that the light is going to turn green, they are going to start crashing lights, which becomes a safety issue too.

Mr. Sage said he thought the issue was it was not letting enough time to let people through once it does turn.

Mr. Herron said no, he said the resident was concerned because he wanted green lights all the way down Bagley, he didn't want the lights to change when cars came up to the intersections. He said the resident's expectation was that it was so early in the morning, the lights on Bagley should remain green and shouldn't change.

Mr. Sage didn't think that was it.

Mr. Herron said that was what his intention was, that the lights shouldn't be changing.

48 Mr. Sage said maybe we could have a conversation with the resident to get clarification.

Mayor Castelli said we will get clarification, and make sure whatever the question is, we will get information and get something in writing from the traffic consultants, that you can provide to the resident.

Mr. Herron said early in the morning, this isn't the only area that this happens.

He said it happens at Fowles and Big Creek and Fowles and Engle.

#### **EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT**

Mr. Downey said sitting here this evening, was a little different than it has ever been. He said he was hearing conversations of a very positive nature, with everybody seeming to be upbeat. Mr. Downey said he has been here 13 years, and now it seems to be more positive, more full of energy and people wanting to get up and do things than he could ever remember. He said the future looks very positive for us, everything seems to be going in a positive fashion. Mr. Downey

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said he asked the mayor for permission to come back to see what is going on and watch and make whatever comments he could make to help out with everything. He said he couldn't do it two weeks ago, but he is doing it tonight, and promised this will be a retirement. Mr. Downey said it has been wonderful. He again thanked everyone for a wonderful time.

Mr. Ference thanked Mr. Downey for his service, and appreciated all that he has done for the city and wished him a happy retirement.
